DESCRIPTION: The Sterling Park District received an Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) T21 Grant to develop a park and pedestrian/bicycle trail from the north end of the Mississippi Dam to the historic Dillon home in Sterling, Illinois.

This Project incorporated scenic overlooks, fishing piers, wrought iron fencing and brick pavers to transition the new footbridge into the historic Dillon home sites. This section of the trail is 800 feet long, crosses beneath the railroad thru an existing stone arch culvert and provides a needed pedestrian link between Sterling and Rock Falls.

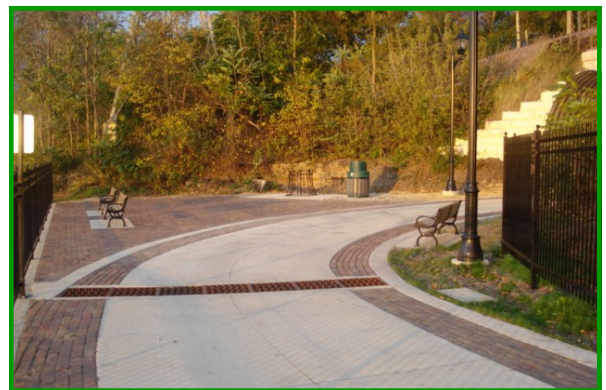
